Guilsfield Show are happy to announce that for 2026 there are no entry fees to any of the individual classes (horse section excluded). Entry to as many classes as you like is included in the show admission price. We hope this will encourage everyone to get involved and have a go at lots of different classes.

Entries still need to be made as per the conditions stated on the section entry form. On entry to the show when the admission price is paid, everyone will be provided with a wristband. This covers your entry fees for the classes you have entered, and you can also leave/re-enter the show as you please during the day.

General Admission

This ticket includes entry to the show (including the music evening) and all class entries (excluding horse entry). Entries to all classes still need to be made in advance by completing the entry forms in the schedule. These can either be posted to the relevant section secretary or entries can be left in an envelope at Harding's Garage or the Bottom Shop. Dog In Cars On Hot Days

- When travelling to the show please consider if the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increase time in traffic jams.
- If your car is not air conditioned, seriously consider whether travelling your dog in a car to the show is a good idea.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible. Plenty of stops should be taken en route with lots of drinking water available.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in direct sunlight. There should be plenty of free-flowing air around your dog.
- Never leave your dog in the vehicle when parked.
- Keep your dog in the shade – if necessary, take your own shade (eg. A large umbrella) and have plenty of water available for your dog to drink.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
- Remember your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated than you and this could lead to dire results.
- Please look after your dog's welfare at all times.
- **If your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle maybe necessary. Guilsfield Show will accept no liability for any damaged caused.**

Blueberry and Marzipan cake

175g softened butter or margarine
175g golden caster sugar
3 eggs
150g self raising flour
25g flaked almonds (optional)

75g ground almonds
125g marzipan cut into small cubes
75g blueberries
1 tsp almond essence

1. Preheat oven to 180°C /160°C fan/gas 4.
2. Grease and line an 8 inch round loose bottomed cake tin (guide only)
3. Cream butter and sugar until pale and fluffy.
4. Beat in eggs one at a time, adding a spoonful of flour at each addition of egg.
5. Beat in almond essence.
6. Sift in flour and ground almonds.
7. Gently fold into mixture.
8. Gently fold in cubes of marzipan and half of the blueberries.
9. Spoon into prepared tin and scatter the remaining blueberries and flaked almonds (if using) on top.
10. Bake for approx. 1 hour to 1 hour 10 mins. Until skewer comes out clean.
11. Allow to cool completely before dusting with icing sugar.

Cappuccino Cake

175g softened butter or margarine
100g golden caster sugar
75g light brown sugar
3 large eggs

2 tbsp instant coffee (decaf can be used)
5 tbsp single cream
1 tsp vanilla extract
175g self raising flour

Frosting

150g mascarpone
Cocoa powder for dusting

5 tbsp icing sugar

1. Preheat oven to 170°C/150°C /gas 3, and line an 8 inch round tin (Guide Only)
2. Heat cream and coffee until warm and stir to dissolve coffee, allow to cool.
3. In a small bowl mix 1tsp of coffee mixture into mascarpone, and chill until needed.
4. Cream butter and sugars until pale and fluffy.
5. Beat in eggs one at a time, adding a spoonful of flour at each addition of egg.
6. Beat in vanilla and remaining coffee cream mixture and mix well.
7. Fold in flour until you have a smooth batter.

125g self raising flour
1 tbsp cocoa powder
125g caster sugar
135g butter softened
2 large eggs

red food colouring paste
1 tsp cider vinegar
½ tsp Bicarbonate of soda
1 tsp vanilla extract
2 tbsp butter milk at room temperature

Cream cheese frosting

75g butter softened
420g icing sugar

120g cream cheese

1. Preheat oven to 190°C 170° C fan / Gas 5
2. Line your cupcake tin with cupcake liners.
3. Sieve flour and cocoa powder into a bowl, add sugar, butter and eggs.
4. Beat with electric mixer for 1 minute, until all ingredients well mixed.
5. Mix food colouring, buttermilk and vanilla extract in a small bowl and then add to cake mixture, mix again until well combined, but not for long.
6. In a cup mix the bicarbonate of soda with the vinegar, it will immediately start to fizz,
7. Working quickly add this to the cake mixture and briefly mix until well incorporated.
8. Fill cupcake liners 2/3 full, and bake for approx. 20 mins until they spring back when touched
9. While cupcakes are baking, make your cream cheese frosting.
10. Drain any liquid from the top of cream cheese, and beat with butter until well combined, slowly add the icing sugar and beat again until well combined and smooth.
11. Allow cupcakes to cool completely before decorating with a swirl of cream cheese frosting, add sprinkles or decorations of your choice.

Wagon Wheel Traybake

100g butter
60g icing sugar
1 tsp vanilla extract
140g plain flour
1 tbsp milk

1 pkt marshmallows
seedless raspberry jam
150g milk chocolate

1. Cream butter and icing sugar until pale and fluffy.
2. Add flour, vanilla extract and milk if needed, mix again until dough starts to clump together.
3. Knead briefly and chill for 1 hour.
4. Line a baking tin roughly 8 in x 8 in
5. Roll out dough to size of your baking tray, put in tray and prick bottom all over with a fork
6. Preheat oven to 180° C fan gas mark 6. Bake base for 10 -12 mins.
7. Remove from oven but leave oven on. Allow to cool slightly to firm then spread a layer of jam all over base
8. Carefully cut the marshmallows in half with scissors and lay over the jam topped base.
9. Pop back in oven until marshmallows have melted approx. 10 mins.
10. Remove from oven and allow to cool completely.
11. Melt chocolate and spread over cooled base. Allow to cool and enjoy.

Gingerbread Stained Glass Windows

375 g plain flour
120g butter cut into cubes
175g light brown sugar
5 tbsps. golden syrup

3 tsps ground ginger
1 medium egg
1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
Packet of hard-boiled fruit sweets

1. Preheat oven to 190 °C / 170 °C fan, Gas 5
2. Sift flour, bicarb and ginger into a bowl and add cold cubed butter.
3. Rub together with fingertips until mixture resembles breadcrumbs.
4. Mix in sugar.
5. Beat egg and syrup together and add to flour mixture, mix well until you have a dough.
6. On a lightly floured surface roll out to ½ cm thickness.
7. Cut out your chosen shapes and then cut out a small shape out of centre
8. Place on a lined baking sheet
9. Place a hard-boiled fruit sweet into centre hole and bake for approx. 9 mins.
10. Allow to cool for approx. 5 mins before transferring to cooling rack.

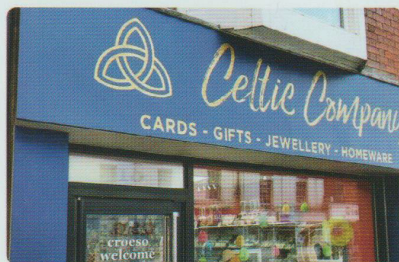
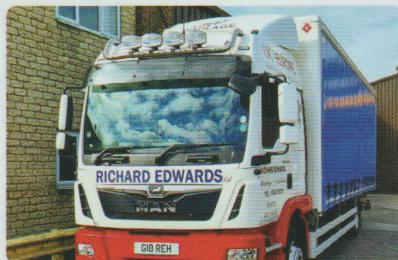
